Investing in HER Power: Impact 2024

2024 was a year of evolution and achievement. Years of determination and expertise culminated in the HER strategy. HER (Holistic, Economic Resilience) is a comprehensive solution to ending poverty for women and families and rooted in an innovative and scalable five-step approach. We renewed our commitment to reducing poverty for women and their families through these programs, and are honored to have touched the lives of millions. Our commitment to investing in women is at the heart of our work, fostering hope and building potential for women despite the hardships they face. Our teams worked in many places around the world.

Here are some of the highlights:

India: Under the MANDI project, addressed farmers' challenges, impacting 12 million people with climate-smart solutions. Now in its second phase, MANDI aims to increase the incomes and resilience of 35,000 smallholder farmers, half of whom are women, in Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal. It also increases the sustainability of 50 farmer-producer organizations.

Ghana: Launched the \$10 Spark for Change Initiative, aimed at changing harmful gendered-mindsets that start within households, achieving real behavior change among 80% of the participants.

Uganda: Building on our existing work in the Uthabiti refugee camp, partnered with MTN Uganda to open a satellite banking branch in the camp, enabling almost 100,000 refugees to gain greater control of their money.

Philippines and Pacific Islands: Strengthened the supply chain for 51,000 smallholder coconut farmers, using our proven holistic approach. This allows them to increase their income, resilience and agency. Our program for entrepreneurs, BELUU, supports local organizations to work directly with women who are building enterprises reliant on healthy oceans and agricultural systems.

We are especially excited about the launch of a new program to combat the financial abuse that affects 1 in 3 women worldwide. Program SAFE (Safeguarding women from Abuse in the Financial Ecosystem) complements our existing work with individuals and communities. Our SAFE Playbook guides financial institutions to prevent, detect and resolve financial abuses, giving women clients more control over their lives.

Looking ahead, Grameen will continue to use digital technology, human-centered design and data-driven insights to deliver solutions that drive positive change. We will continue working through partnerships -- leveraging resources from larger organizations and supporting grassroots organizations that serve low-income women. Our work will continue to strengthen the ecosystems in which the poor, especially women, operate, enabling them to build more resilient lives.

Why is this important?

- Agents provide financial services directly to communities.
- Barriers to banking include lack of identification, distance to branches, low income, and distrust in services.
- Although financial service providers (FSPs) have improved offerings, information dissemination is still lacking, especially in rural areas.
- Agent networks can effectively address these challenges by increasing understanding and confidence in services, facilitating transactions, and ensuring accessible cash deposits and withdrawals.
- Mobile money agents are particularly beneficial for women, who face additional barriers.
- On average, agents see an income increase of 20-70%, moving them over the poverty line

In 2024, our TogetHER,
We Grow (Women
Farmers) and InvestHER
(Women Entrepreneurs)
programs made significant
impacts through our agent
networks, especially in
India.

Key outcomes include:

- 230% increase in total sales turnover in Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs).
- 122% growth in female shareholders.
- **82**% of farmers improved negotiation skills and trust in FPOs.
- 15% increase in women making independent decisions.
- Client satisfaction with mobile money agents improved from 19% to 95%.

Our skilled volunteer core is making an impact in organizations throughout the world, providing insight, tools and resources to make local non-profit organizations, social enterprises, and small businesses more impactful and resilient.

From July 01, 2024, to June 30, 2025, we have deployed 208 volunteers to provide volunteer consulting support to 36 host organizations in 5 countries: The United States, the Philippines, India, Ghana and Uganda. We are increasing our US presence and have served 23 microenterprises in the US alone.

The volunteers contributed a total of 12,990 hours, an equivalent of USD 2,311,178 of in-kind services. Today, Bankers without Borders consists of 27,456 volunteers. Since our inception 17 years ago, we have served 396 client organizations in 41 countries and volunteers have provided USD 35.1M of in-kind services.

To amplify impact, Grameen supports other organizations through initiatives like Bankers without Borders® and provides tools for measuring poverty and data collection in remote areas. By equipping women with resources and support, Grameen Foundation builds resilient communities and alleviates poverty.
